Taikyōin — 1875 dissolved — 1945 Religious Corporation Ordinance

1814 [Kurozumi Munetada, Tenmeijikiju] — 1872 【Kurozumi kōsha】 — 1876 Shintō Kurozumiha — 1882 Kurozumikyō

1859 [Nitta Kunitaru, Monjinkyōdō] — 1873 【Shūseikōsha】 — 1876 Shintōshūseiha

[Isejingūsūkei] — 1872 【Jingūkyōkai】 — 1882 Shintō jingūha → Jingūkyō → 1889 dissolved as a religious organization, continued activities as a foundation (Zaidanhōjin Jingūhōsankai)

[Izumotaishasūkei] — 1873 【Izumotaishakeishinkō】 — 1876 Izumotaishakyōkai — Shintō taishaha → Taishakyō

[Fujishinkō] — 1873 【Fujūssankōsha】 — 1876 【Fusōkyōkai】 — Shintō fusōha → Fusōkyō

(Fujidō) — Shintō jikkōha → Jikkōkyō

1880 【Kōsha Shinshūkyōkai】 — Shintō shinshūha → Shinshūkyō

1879 【Taiseikyōkai】 — Shintō taiseiha → Taiseikyō

→ Shintō-shūseiha
→ Shinshūkyō

[Ontakeshinkō] — 1873 【Ontakekyōkai】 — 1880 temporary merger with Taiseikyōkai — 1882 Shintō ontakeha → Ontakekyō

1875 Shintō jimukyoku — 1886 Shintō (Honkyoku) — 1940 Shintō taikyō

1838 [Inoue Masakane, becomes Shinto Priest (Shinshoku)] — Taiseikyō — 1872 Tōkamikō — 1876 changed name of organization to Misogikyō — 1894 Misogikyō

1877 [Sano Tsunehiko, Kōseki] — 1881 【Shinrikyōkai】 — 1884 placed under the direct control of Shinto Honkyoku — 1888 transfer of affiliation to Ontake — 1894 Shinrikyō

1859 [Konkōdaijin describes *Rikkyōshinden*] — 1885 【Konkōkyōkai】 — 1887 placed under the direct control of Shinto Honkyoku — 1900 Konkōkyō

1838 [Nakayama Miki becomes "Tsukihinoyashiro"] — 1880 【Tenrinōkōsha】 — 1885 【Tenrikyōkai】 , placed under the direct control of Shinto Honkyoku — 1908 Tenrikyō

1870 [Itō Rokubē] — 1875 [merger with Fuji issankōsha] — 1881 【Fusōkyōkai maruyamakyō】 — 1885 transfer of affiliation to Shinto Honkyoku — 1946 Maruyamakyō

1877 [Jimyōhōkeishinjo] — 1882 【Renmonkōsha】 , attached to Taiseikyō — 1911 transfer of affiliation to Shinto Honkyoku — 1914 Shintō tōitsukyōkai (transfer of affiliation to Fusōkyō)

→ the group ceases to exist
